

Boy, 18, Wounds Sheriff, 3 Others

Official Critical After Head Shot; Fleeing Youth Seized

The Woodford County sheriff, Joseph Wolf, 31, was shot in the head early Monday near Peoria by an 18-year-old youth recently released from a reformatory.

Wolf is in critical condition in a hospital in Eureka, about 130 miles southwest of Chicago.

THE YOUTH, Howard Belsy, also wounded a Eureka farmer and two other youths in the shooting spree.

Belsy was captured a short time later by state police near Morton.

State police said the shooting took place on the farm of Daniel Krumholz, about five miles west of Eureka on Route 24 where Belsy attempted to steal a car.

KRUMHOLZ and his son William, 18, were wounded in the arms. They were treated and released at the Eureka hospital.

Clarence Mitzolt, 19, who lives near the Krumholz farm, was wounded by

the blast from Belsy's 20-gauge shotgun. He is in poor condition in the Eureka hospital.

State police said Wolf went to the Krumholz farm in response to a telephone call.

The sheriff was standing in the living room of the house questioning Krumholz and the two others when Belsy fired the shotgun blast at them through a window.

BELSY, who lived on a nearby farm, fled in Krumholz's car.

He wrecked it a few miles away, stole a second car which he abandoned and took a third car which he was driving when captured.

State police said Belsy had been released from a reformatory the day before Christmas.

HEARING AWAITED

Drop Order to Halt Probe of Assessor

Federal Judge Philip L. Sullivan Monday refused to sign an order halting an investigation of the County Assessor's office after he had issued the order orally.

Judge Sullivan continued the matter until Jan. 9, when it will be heard by Judge Michael Igoe.

JUDGE Sullivan first orally ordered U.S. Attorney Robert Ticken to halt temporarily the investigation of reported personal property tax fixing in the office under former Assessor Frank Keenan.

But when John P. Lulinski, head of the government appeals division in the U.S. Attorney's office, objected that the order as drafted was too broad, Judge Sullivan refused to sign it.

The restraining order was drafted by L. Louis Karton, an attorney representing four attorneys who have appealed an earlier order by Judge Sullivan instructing them to answer certain questions concerning the assessor's office for a federal grand jury.

3 Tots Die in Blaze

Three children burned to death early Monday when their mother was unable to go back into her blazing basement apartment after leading her four other youngsters to safety.

Firemen said two of the victims, Frances Moore, 6, and her sister, Brenda, 4, apparently tried to flee also.

Their bodies were found in the living room of the apartment at 1458 W. 109th st.

The body of the third child, Dolnes, 2½, was found in the bedroom where he had been sleeping with Frances and Brenda.
