The New Police.

The Police Commissioners were in session again yesterday, and having carried the list of appointments on the police up to thirty-three, have now adjourned for three weeks.

It should have been before stated that Mr. Coventry has been chosen President and Mr. Wayman Treasurer of the Board. The Commissioners having drawn lots, the long term of six years falls to Mr. Coventry, the intermediate term of four years to Mr. Wayman, and the shortest, of two years, to Mr. Tuttle.
