POLICE CHANGES.

THE NEW SUB-STATION AT THE CORNER OF WEST-ERN AVENUE

The changes made necessary by these two important improvements are announced by Superintendent McGarrick in the following order, which was promulgated throughout the department early last evening:

1. Stationkeeper Albert G. Dutton and Patrolmen George W. Hubbard, James Brennan, and Henry C. Scott of the Second Precinct are hereby transferred to the Third Precinct.
2. Patrolman Sylvester Kennedy of the Third Precinct is hereby appointed Stationkeeper, and will, with Albert G. Dutton, be assigned to duty at West Madison Street Sub-Station.
3. The police telegraph-wagons for West Lake street and West Madison street sub-districts being now ready for use the following details are made therefor—viz.: For wagon in West Lake street district, George W. Hubbard, Benjamin Williams, John T. O'Hara, Edward Ryan, Thomas Grady, and Edwin P. Mann. For wagon in West Madison street sub-district, John Hooley, Henry C. Scott, James Brennan, and W. W. Cluett.
4. Capt. F. Ebersold will transfer six patrolmen from West Lake Street to West Madison Street Sub-Station, who will be assigned to patrol duty in that district.
5. Patrolman John H. O'Grady, of West Twelfth Street Station, is hereby appointed Stationkeeper, and will be assigned to duty at said station, vice Albert G. Dutton, transferred.
