POLICE MATTERS.

A New District on the South Side--Review Next Saturday.

The following orders were promulgated yesterday morning from police headquarters:

The territory bounded north by Thirty-first street, south by the city-limits, east by State street, and west by Ashland avenue is hereby constituted a police district in the First Precinct, and will be known in the department as the Thirty-fifth Street Police District, with quarters in the new police station on Thirty-fifth street, east of Halsted street.

The southern boundary of the Twenty-second Street District will hereafter be Thirty-first street.

The southern boundary of the Deering Street District from South Halsted street to Ashland avenue will hereafter be Thirty-first street, and from Ashland avenue west to the city-limits the southern boundary will be Thirty-ninth street as heretofore.

Detective Edward Loughlin, of the Central Station, is hereby transferred to the First Precinct. He will report to Capt. Buckley for assignment to duty as Acting Lieutenant in command of the Thirty-fifth Street District.

Patrolman Francis Campbell, of the First Precinct, is hereby assigned to duty as Acting Sergeant at the Thirty-fifth Street Station.

Stationkeeper William J. Mooney is hereby transferred from Twenty-second Street to Thirty-fifth Street Station.

Patrolman Michael S. Hyland, of Twenty-second Street Station, is hereby assigned to duty as Acting Stationkeeper at said station, vice William J. Mooney, transferred.

Patrolman Thomas Downs, of the First Precinct, is hereby assigned to duty as Acting Stationkeeper at Thirty-fifth Street Station.

This order will take effect at 1 o'clock p. m. 19th inst.

Ten patrolmen have been transferred to the new station for duty, and there is also a police patrol-wagon stationed there.

Captains and Lieutenants of police will direct all members of the force in their respective commands to arrest, and rearrest if necessary, all known thieves and vagrants that are found in the city.

The fact that convictions frequently fall in the courts should not deter police officers from doing their full duty, for this only necessitates renewed energy and watchfulness on the part of the entire force.

The duties and instructions of police officers in this respect are plain, and must be carried out.
