

## **SQUELCH ARVEY'S MOVE TO ABOLISH POLICE CAPTAINS**

The move of Ald. Jacob M. Arvey [24th] to eliminate captaincies from the police department collapsed yesterday when he admitted to the council police committee that he was unable to suggest a feasible reorganization scheme.

Heated discussion of his plan to replace the captains with three lieutenants, each equal in authority, was capped by the advice of Ald. C. S. Eaton [5th] that the council cease meddling with the department's organization. Arvey's order was "fled," temporarily at least, when Ald. T. F. Byrne [15th] refused to appoint a sub-committee to consider the suggested changes.

"I believe the best results in the history of the department are being obtained under the supervision of Chief Collins," said Ald. Eaton.

Lieut. William D. Ambrose of the Warren avenue station is alleged to have accepted or "shaken" a \$20 bribe from Nicholas Monaco, a soft drink parlor proprietor at 2761 West Lake street, in charges filed before the civil service commission.

Policeman James L. Kelly, who switched revolvers with a brother officer, James Muleahy, after a brawl in which Jennie Plarr, a cabaret girl was shot, was ordered discharged by the civil service commission.
