

## CAPT. SAMMIS RESIGNS LINCOLN PARK POLICE COMMAND ON TUESDAY

James U. Sammis Jr., head of the Lincoln park police since January, 1931, yesterday

handed his resignation, effective next Tuesday, to George T. Donoghue, general superintendent of the Chicago park district. Sammis, who has been in charge of the north division of the park police since the park consolidation, said he wishes to reënter the business field and is considering several

offers he has received recently.

Sammis, who has the rank of captain in the park police force, is a major in the Illinois National Guard. He served as a private on the Mexican border in 1916 and went overseas in the world war as a first lieutenant. Under his direction the Lincoln park police force was known for its discipline. In January, 1933, he was commended for preventing a serious riot when his men controled a communist demonstration directed against the Japanese consulate.

Sammis was associated with the oil industry at Freeport, La., before becoming a police commander here.
