

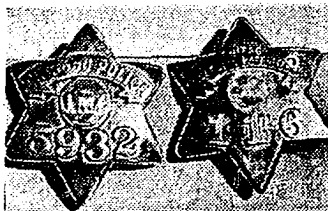
PROBE ORDERED INTO SALE OF POLICE STARS

State's Atty. Boyle has ordered an investigation of the activities of the Metropolitan Detective agency and the claim of one of its operatives that Milton A. Robinson of 508 W. Tremont st., head of the agency, has issued stars and gun permits to more than 200 men in Chicago.

The agency's activities were disclosed after Detective Robert C. Schmidt arrested Morgan Gibson, Negro, of 1329 W. 109th st., for carrying a concealed weapon. Gib-



son displayed a permit issued by Robinson, who had been chief of police of Robbins for five years until 1948. Since then Robinson organized the agency.

Gibson, who was found guilty by Judge John Gutknecht in Racket court Tuesday, said Robinson had issued more than 200 stars and gun permits, charging \$10 to \$20 each. Schmidt said the star that Gibson displayed was similar to a Chicago police star but with the words "Chicago Police" removed.
