

# ASSIGN PARK POLICE TO TOP POSTS IN CITY

George A. Otletwis, chief of the park district police, will become deputy chief of the city's uniformed force when the two departments are merged Thursday, Police Commissioner Timothy J. O'Connor revealed Monday.

As such Otletwis will serve under Chief Thomas V. Lyons who, at present, has two deputies, Captains James Hackett and Robert E. Ryan.
