

WILSON TELLS OF PLANS FOR DEPUTY AIDS

Contemplated reorganization of the police department under the 1961 budget will include the creation of four new assistant deputy superintendents in the division of field services, and seven new deputy chiefs of the patrol division. Superintendent of Police O. W. Wilson disclosed yesterday.

In a communication to district commanders, Wilson said that the four assistant deputy superintendents will make it possible to have round the clock operation of the field services, which supervises the assignments of police personnel. The department is headed by Deputy Superintendent James B. Conlisk, Jr.

One of the seven new deputy chiefs will be the administrative deputy, while the other six will head six local areas yet to be designated. Headquarters of the new areas will be in the Prairie avenue, B u r n s i d e, Brighton Park, M a x w e l l street, Shakespeare avenue, and North Damen avenue stations.
