

MAYOR FAVORS CADET UNIT IN POLICE FORCE

Mayor Daley indicated yesterday that he favors a proposal to establish a cadet program in the Chicago police department. He said he would discuss the proposal with Police Supt. Orlando W. Wilson who said the day before he liked the idea.

"I think it has a lot of merit," Daley said. "By building up a great corps of young people we could provide the police department with needed additional manpower."

Creation of a cadet corps

was proposed Wednesday in the city council meeting by Ald. John J. Hoellen [47th]. He cited success of the Cincinnati police cadet corps, in which youths 17 to 21 chiefly do "inside" jobs for that department. Hoellen said he thought cadets also could be used to "break up police gangs."
