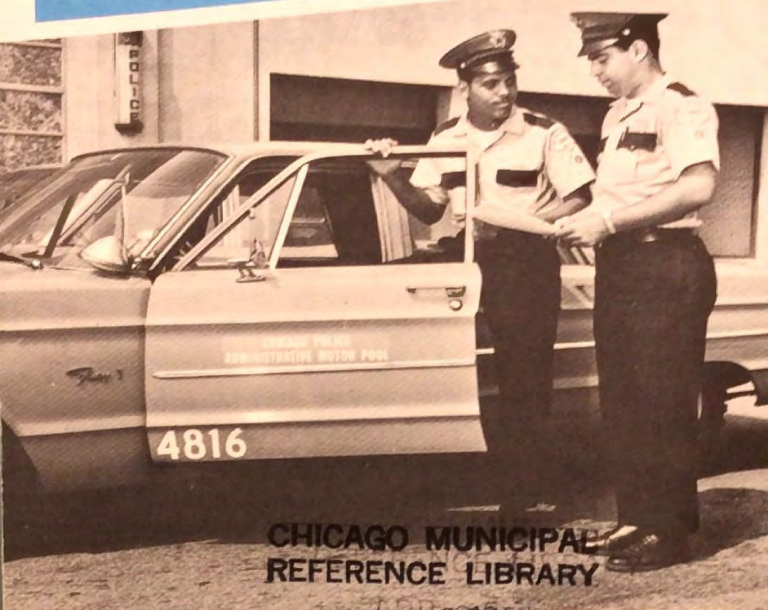

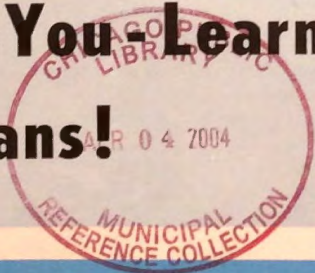

# EXCITING CAREERS IN LAW ENFORCEMENT

**Begin a law enforcement career and earn while you learn as a Chicago Police cadet**

## Pre-Service Training

Prepare for Department duties through initial training course at Chicago Police Training Academy.

## Duties

Move to varied and interesting new assignments at regular intervals. Assignments include district stations; Task Force units; Detective and Traffic divisions; and headquarters units, such as Communications Center and Public Information Division.

## In-Service Training

Get on-the-job training and additional Police Academy in-service courses.

## College Education

Continue your education without interruption. Enroll for courses in local college or university—see options at right.

## Career Advancement

Become eligible to take Patrolman's exam at age 20. Receive additional training before field assignment.

Continue to earn as you learn for advancement to specialized assignments such as Detective, Youth Officer or Radio Dispatcher.

Achieve promotion to Sergeant, Lieutenant, Captain, and top command positions.

# Your Choice of Two Options!

## 1. FULL-TIME, 40-HOUR OPTION

Work as Police Cadet for 40 hours weekly.

Enroll, or continue, at college for a minimum of 12 credit hours per year. (Work hours adjusted to your college program.)

Enjoy these benefits:

- Five-day work week
- Cumulative sick leave
- Eleven paid holidays a year
- Two weeks annual vacation with pay
- Paid hospitalization insurance
- Clothing allowance

### SALARY:

\$5,340 annual salary - first 6 months  
\$5,604 annual salary - next 12 months  
\$5,892 annual salary - next 12 months  
\$6,180 annual salary - next 12 months

## 2. PART-TIME, 20-HOUR OPTION

Work as Police Cadet for 20 hours per week.

Enroll, or continue, at college for full 24 credit hours per year.

### SALARY:

\$2.78 per hour - first 6 months  
\$2.92 per hour - next 12 months  
\$3.07 per hour - next 12 months  
\$3.21 per hour - next 12 months

## You Are Eligible

### TO BECOME A CHICAGO POLICE CADET IF YOU MEET THESE REQUIREMENTS:

**Citizenship:** United States.

**Residence:** City of Chicago, after appointment.

**Age:** At least 17 and not yet 19

**Physical Condition:** Excellent health and physical fitness.

**Vision:** Without glasses, at least 20/40 in each eye. With glasses, combined vision corrected to 20/20.

**Height/Weight:** 5'7" to 6'3" — 130 to 200 lbs.  
(weight limits relate to height).

**Mental Ability:** Above average.

#### Education

**Option 1:** High school graduation. (Seniors scheduled to graduate within two months may take initial examinations.)

**Option 2:** Enrolled full-time at accredited college and maintaining average of C or better.

**Character:** Good reputation and high moral standards.

Through its cadet program, the department offers young men an outstanding opportunity to become self-sufficient and career-minded while continuing in the pursuit of higher education.

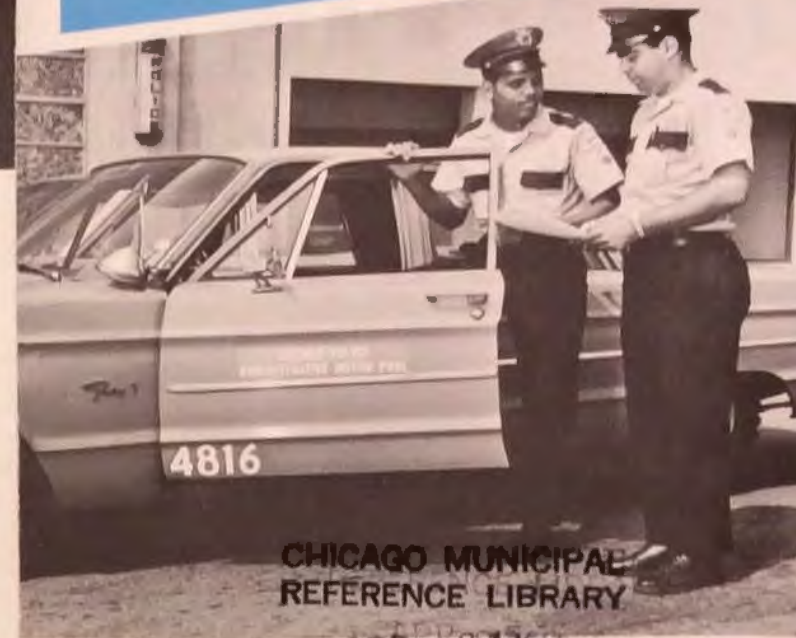

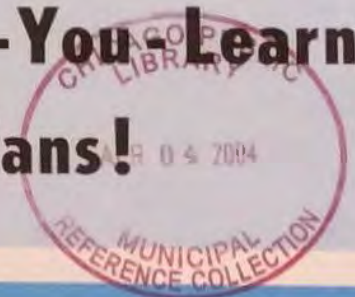
