

## North Siders Among New Police Cadets

Four north siders are among 106 teen-agers who were appointed police cadets recently by Superintendent O. W. Wilson.

The new cadets, screened from 950 applicants between ages of 17-19, comprise the second group of cadets appointed to the department. The first class of 62 began training July 1, 1963, and 49 of them are still in the program.

New cadets from the north side are Daniel Dinges, 3241-3 N. Damen av., John Farrell, 3921 N. Hermitage av.; James Hopper, 4229 N. Ashland av.; and Phillip Schlenbecker, 906 Montrose av.

The class will begin training Wednesday, when 50 cadets will begin combing neighborhoods for unlicensed dogs. Others will relieve last year's cadets at various assignments. Cadet assignments are rotated during the year.

The training period includes a weekly work schedule of 40 hours and six semester hours of related academic studies in local colleges and universities. After their 21st birthday cadets are eligible to take the patrolman's civil service examination.
